

Emergency Preparedness for Port Anne

The goal is for every resident of Port Anne to be self-sufficient for at least three days (water, food, medical supplies and lighting).

When a pending event threatens our area, each resident should monitor local media and the NWS alert notification system.

The Port Anne Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) will provide coordination and limited assistance to the residents of Port Anne in the event of an emergency. The EPC is not designed to replace the roles of the Williamsburg Fire or Police Departments. The EPC's role is to report damage to the City and provide limited aid following an event. If an event strikes Port Anne and normal communications systems are damaged, look for members of the EPC to report damage or injuries.
